Yes, its that time again when the children will be traveling to school. To ensure the safety of everyone during this season, give yourself plenty of time when driving during the morning and late afternoon hours and take the following precautions:

- **Be alert; children often take risks and are unpredictable and tend to ignore hazards on the road**
- **If a school bus is stopped with red or yellow blinking lights while loading/unloading children, never pass the bus in either direction.**
- **Watch for bike riders turning in front of you without looking or signaling; children especially have a tendency to do this**
- **Check side mirrors before opening your car door**
- **Be extra vigilant when driving through school zones and residential neighborhoods**

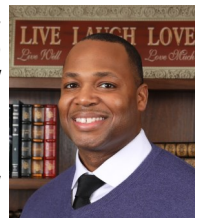

Marijuana Prohibited



Despite the fact that recreational marijuana use is allowed in Washington State, it is still considered a Schedule 1 of controlled substance at the federal level. Lease Page 5, Paragraph 9a states: use, possession or sale of drugs is prohibited, including marijuana and is therefore a unauthorized anywhere in Constitution Family Housing. Even if prescribed by a physician for medicinal use. This prohibition is listed under section 12 of your community handbook.

Pets & Compliance

Living in family housing has its benefits: proximity to base activities and services as well as creating a real sense of community. But living so close together can have its challenges, too. By following a few simple rules, it will help ensure a positive environment for all.

PETS: Clean up after your pets in your home, in your yard and especially whenever they are in the community. Pets must be leashed at all times and cannot be left unattended outside and tied to common area trees, posts or other fixtures. When we can identify a pet owner who is not picking up after their pets, and we have to pick up after the pet we will charge the pet owner \$20 per pile picked up. Do not feed your pets outside as pet food attracts wildlife. Also, it is a provision in the lease that all pets be registered with the office and, current rabies vaccination records, microchip number record and photos must be turned in as part of a resident's file. 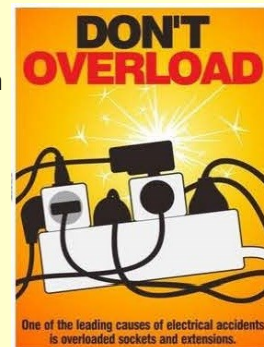

Surge Protector Safety

Safeguard electronics with surge protectors. Follow these tips to keep you and your electronics safe. Only use surge protectors with internal circuit breakers. These units will trip the breaker if the power strip is overloaded to prevent overheating. Here are some electrical tips in keeping your home and family safe:

- ◆ Don't use surge protectors as permanent wiring.
- ◆ Unplug the surge protector when not in use.
- ◆ Don't plug a surge protector into an existing surge protector or power strip.
- ◆ Replace your surge protector if it is hot to the touch, has frayed wires, or is not working properly.
- ◆ Be sure that the UL-listed product is a transient voltage surge suppressor.
