Constitution Park Town Hall Minutes

Town hall meeting was called to order Tuesday May 24th at 1700. The meeting was held indoors at the Community Center. Four residents attended. Representatives from Installation (CO, IN9, and Housing Service Center) and Constitution Park Community Director were present. Additionally, representatives from Fleet and Family Service Center and MWR were also present to promote their programs.

CAPT Menzel spoke about the upcoming Third party inspections mandated by Congress on all PPV units that will be held in July 11 thru July 22. These inspections he stated is to protect the residents and to ensure homes are within housing codes. All 141 homes need to be inspected and is encouraged that a resident be home for the inspection. HSC will be calling residents to set up appointments. With USS MOMSEN currently deployed, Mrs. Roberts asked if she can represent the residents in case they will not be home. Other topics discussed included:

Washer/dryer hook ups- we've had washer leaks that the resident has been responsible and has been very expensive. He strongly recommended have renters insurance that covers water damage. Hunt representative also mentioned to ensure families have the right type of insurance.

Community "Pride and Ownership". Residents are responsible for home exterior; mowing/weeding of their back yards and to continue to make CP a nice place to live.
